Huge thanks to everyone who has been so supportive, there were too many comments to share all of them here. All BBEC's staff work really hard, and it is fabulous to know that you appreciate their efforts.

As always, we want to work in partnership with parents and carers and so I am asking for your support with:

1. Attendance

Lots of our students have fabulous attendance and always arrive on time and this week we have celebrated and rewarded hundreds of them for 100% attendance this term and some for the whole year. Well done to all of our students who have received vouchers, Easter eggs and certificates – keep it up next term! Good attendance really means success in learning.

It is a legal requirement for parents/carers to ensure that their children attend school and attend well. We have had to issue penalty notices to the parents/carers of some students whose attendance is poor. Penalty notices can result in a fine of up to £120 and a court case if the fine is not paid.

For others whose attendance has not been so good this term, the good news is that we start afresh next term with everyone having the chance to hit that 100% attendance mark all over again. Let's make next term our best attendance possible with every student achieving over 94%.

2. Punctuality

We have focused this last half term on lateness to school and lessons. Students with repeated lateness have time in isolation and either miss their lunchtime play or have a detention after school. We have already seen a real reduction in the number of students arriving late to lessons. This push will be continuing after the Easter holiday. Students who arrive on time are courteous to their teachers and can make the most of learning.

3. Mobile phones

Please remind your child(ren) that mobile phones should not be used in school and will be confiscated if they are seen. If parents need to contact children during the school day, please contact reception and we will pass any urgent messages on. Please do not contact your child directly.

4. Sports/energy drinks, fizzy drinks:

Shops close to school have been selling such drinks 'on offer' but they are not allowed in school. Such drinks will be confiscated and disposed of if they are brought into school.

5. Jewellery, hair colour, nails and false eyelashes:

Our rules are clear and are suitable for a school environment. Jewellery should be limited to a watch and plain, small stud earrings (one per ear) if required, nails should be of a short length and false eyelashes (individual or multi) are **not suitable** for school and are not allowed. Hair colour should be natural. All these rules are clearly written in the student planner. Please ensure that your child(ren) does not come to school breaking these rules.



6. Uniform:

BBEC has a really smart uniform, and we expect all students to uphold our high standards of dress. Full school uniform should be worn. We **expect that all school uniform issues should be resolved after the Easter holiday**. There should be **no** students wearing trainers and school trousers (not leggings) should be worn. Please contact us on <u>admin@buttershaw.net</u> if you have any financial difficulties buying uniform and we will see how we can support you.

Students are allowed to wear **summer uniform** after the holiday. Summer uniform consists of a polo shirt in the same colour as the year group school jumper, school trousers and a BBEC blazer.



Students who do not wish to wear summer uniform should continue wearing shirt, tie, jumper, trousers and blazers as normal.
