Happy New Year!

I hope you all managed to have some quality time over the Christmas period, with some opportunities to relax with family and friends, despite the inevitable colds and other illnesses prevalent.

It has been an excellent start to the New Year so far, and it has been a pleasure visiting lessons to witness such high levels of engagement. We are not complacent, however, and are well aware that there will always be more to do!

On Time, Every Time

Thank you to all parents and carers for your support with our procedures for dealing with students who are late to lessons. These have been in place for half a term now and have had a significant impact on students being on time, limiting any disruption to learning. As a result, lateness to lessons has reduced by 53%, which is excellent. Of course, we can still reduce this further, so please continue to ensure that your child has their planner, and therefore their timetable, with them every day. These are checked on arrival to school each morning.

Mock Exams

The vast majority of Year 11 students conducted themselves very well during their mock exam season. Now that result has been collated and analysed, identified students have been allocated a mentor, who will be discussing exam and revision techniques in the next few weeks in order to ensure the best chance of success in the summer.

Year 11 are now working towards their second set of mock exams which start after February half-term. Students are really focused now on getting the best GCSE and BTEC grades they can, and planning the next step in their education after the summer.

Homework

Last term, students were rewarded with achievement points for completing their homework. In particular, Year 7 students performed exceptionally well and we were able to celebrate their achievement with an end of term party. We will continue to reward students this term and would ask for your continuing support in ensuring that students complete homework. Prizes will be awarded in assembly each week and, at the end of this half-term, students can compete to win a JustEat voucher.

Student Parliament

This year the Health and Wellbeing department have separated into two groups, one focussing on mental health and the other on physical health. The physical health team are looking to plan, advertise and lead sports clubs targeting students who may not participate in sport outside of school. The mental health team are creating a film









and book club which will offer students a friendly and supportive environment to meet and discuss stories and films they love.

The Community department have also split into two groups; one group will be a set of journalists seeking out news stories which will feature in an entirely student created and edited termly magazine. The other team will focus on creating events for our community, supporting with events such as the Christmas Festival, Senior Citizens Christmas dinner and many more.

The Diversity department will be continuing with the pursuit to achieve the Bronze and Silver Diversity Mark. They have started by working with Grange Co-op Academy focusing on improving community links and dispelling myths and negative aspersions about our schools.

Finally, our Lead Prefects are creating a Uniform Swap Shop where parents and other members of the community can donate and collect second-hand uniform free of charge.

Enrichment Activities/Clubs

This term promises to be another busy one for enrichment activities.

Our extracurricular programme for spring has been launched to all students and their activities will start in the week beginning 9 January 2023. If you need any information please see Ms Holdsworth or Mr Ryan.

On Tuesday 7 February we have our BDAT Be There V production at the incredible venue of St George's Hall, which showcases performing arts talents from BBEC, Belle Vue Girls', Bradford Forster Academy and Immanuel College. There will be an afternoon matinee performance attended by all Year 7 students and then an evening performance, which is free of charge and available to everybody – tickets are available to collect from student reception. Please support this amazing event.

In the week beginning 20 March, we have the Year 8 and 9 residentials taking place and we ask all parents/carers to ensure that final payments have been made. On Wednesday 22 March the remainder of Year 8 and 9 and all Year 7 and 10 students will take part in Horizons Day activities, involving trips to many destinations around the North of England and these experiences will contribute further towards their Minimum Entitlement.

Work Experience is also still on the agenda for Year 10 and we continue to encourage all students to source a placement before half-term and return completed yellow Op1 forms to student reception. Our Year 11 students should also be finalising applications for future destinations on education, training or apprenticeships and employment pathways and have recently had a presentation on apprenticeships to support this option. If students from Year 10 or 11 need support, then please see Mr Grant (Mondays and Thursdays) or Mr Ryan.

Our fantastic Duke of Edinburgh programme is now in its second year and has been launched to Year 9 (Bronze Award) and Year 10 (Silver Award) and parent information evenings were held before Christmas. More information can be obtained from Mr Pollard.

Rewards will continue to build towards half term and then Easter with our traditional Easter Eggs being one of the awards students can receive with their points also contributing to the end-of-year summer experiences. We were extremely pleased to see over a thousand students enjoying the rewards films before Christmas.
