	<p><b>Pip.</b> Full name is Philip Pirrip but goes by the name of Pip as he is unable to pronounce his name. Both parents are dead and are buried in the churchyard along with his 5 brothers who all died as children.</p>
	<p><b>Mrs Joe.</b> Pip’s sister. Pip lives with Joe and Mrs Joe Gargery. She raises Pip ‘by hand’ with the tickler. She is a harsh and violent woman.</p>
	<p><b>Joe.</b> Works in the forge. Is a foil (has opposite traits) to Mrs Joe. Joe is kind, loving and nurturing.</p>
	<p><b>Convict.</b> Real name is Abel Magwitch. He meets Pip on the marshes and threatens to cut his throat. He has a great iron around his leg because he has escaped from the prison hulk. When he finds out Pip lives at the forge, he asks Pip to get wittles and a file.</p>

<p>Bildungsroman</p>	<p><i>A coming of age story.</i></p>
<p>allegory</p>	<p><i>A story with a hidden meaning, often moral or political.</i></p>
<p>Malthusian</p>	<p><i>Refers to Thomas Malthus and his Malthusian policies (e.g. The Poor Law).</i></p>
<p>Characterisation</p>	<p><i>The creation and use of characters.</i></p>
<p>Protagonist</p>	<p><i>Lead character, often the hero.</i></p>
