	Joe. Works in the forge. Is a foil (has opposite traits) to Mrs Joe. Joe is kind, loving and nurturing.
	Convict. Real name is Abel Magwitch. He meets Pip on the marshes and threatens to cut his throat. He has a great iron around his leg because he has escaped from the prison hulk. When he finds out Pip lives at the forge, he asks Pip to get wittles and a file.
