BBEC PREFECTS

Democracy is pivotal to life in modern Britain, therefore during January we held a whole school election to appoint prefects from Year 7-11, providing our students the exciting opportunity to vote.

Students received a ballot paper and queued patiently to cast their vote to elect their year group prefects. The candidates were selected based upon their achievement points and attendance, indicating that they consistently make the right choices. In Year 10 and Year 11 additional votes were cast to elect Deputy Head Boy/Girl and Head Boy and Girl respectively. However in Year 11 we had a tie! Therefore we have two Head Girls!

Since the election our prefects have been busy at work meeting and suggesting ways to improve the school environment which our Head Boy and Girl(s) will put to Governors on March 26th. Alongside this ten of our prefects have committed to stamp out bullying at BBEC by completing and being awarded the Diana Anti-Bullying Award on 6th March. Already we are in the process of setting up a peer drop in centre where students can discuss any bullying concerns with their peers, each form has created an anti-bullying pledge and our Anti-Bullying Ambassadors are due to run a staff CPD session after school on Wednesday 21st March to share what they have learned.

We are exceptionally proud of the positive steps our students are making to improve our school environment.





BBEC BORMIO SKI TRIP 2018

In February 2018 40 students and six staff embarked on a monstrous 29 hour bus ride, passing through five different countries for our first ski trip in over seven years. Backs ached, legs were squashed and sleep was patchy at best. It was TOTALLY worth it.

When we began to see our first snow capped mountains the buzz around the bus grew as students stared out of the window. Then after travelling up the hill for ten miles through the Strada Del Passo Dello Stelvio (or 'long tunnel' to us Yorkshire folk) the buzz rose even further as we emerged to snow pouring from the sky!

Finally we arrived at our hotel which overlooked the main World Cup ski run down the mountain. From our windows and balconies you could see skiers skiing down the mountain with amazing skill and speed. This time the next day that would be us (at least in our minds with the same amount of skill and speed). The buzz kept growing, the bus journey long forgotten.

Our first day on the mountain saw glorious sunshine. With boots fitted and skis collected we looked around at the amazing scenery and the winding ski slopes we were about to face.

Each ski group had their own professional instructor who catered for its ability and development throughout the week. The base for the skiing was Bormio 2000 - a gondola ride from the base of the town to 2000m above sea level. There were restaurants, shops and ski slopes in every direction.

There were a variety of lifts taking us everywhere on the mountain. Each day we progressed more and more, exploring and discovering new areas to ski down. There were many long, wide, winding slopes which got progressively more challenging as we become more adept. By the end of the week all students had travelled up to 3000m and skied down to the village. This journey of continuous skiing winds down the mountain across vast open pistes at the top from where you could see for miles across the mountain ranges, to winding narrow pistes through trees (and occasionally off piste) near the bottom. It covered 11km and was truly one of the best and most exciting experiences money can buy.

After a very tiring and rewarding week, the long journey home began, only this journey was much easier. People chatted about the experiences they had and slept like there was no tomorrow. 29 hours on a bus....totally worth it.























National Science Week has been celebrated across the BDAT schools and by our brilliant students at BBEC. There have been many highlights, though possibly the most notable was the science staff delivering assemblies based on a theme of "Awe and Wonder" and these have been thoroughly enjoyed by students from Year 7 to 11. As co-ordinator of the events, I had the very tough decision of awarding the "Best Assembly "prize and the trophy that accompanied it went to Mr Scotcher - who blew us up and away with his "Hydrogen" theme.

The STEM Academy, led by Mr A Hussain, also delivered an engaging renewable energy workshop to every Year 7 student. The whole week began with our Key Stage 4 science team winning the BDAT Science Competition at Immanuel College and our Key Stage 3 science team coming a very close second.

In the sad week that we lost Professor Stephen Hawking it was fantastic to see so many of our students taking up the science mantle. We are already looking forward to next year.
