

Coronavirus Workforce Impacts – Bradford (*impacts since March 2020***)**





Job Retention Scheme – The 3rd June 2021 release provides claims data as at the end of April 2021, but claims data from the start of April is provisional and likely to be revised. There has been a downward revision to the number of employments eligible for the CJRS extension.


Claimants

The claimant count is a measure released monthly of the number of people claiming unemployment related benefits. The Bradford District claimant rate (proportion of residents aged


16 - 64) increased from 5.2% in March 2020 to 9.3% in May 2021. The 18-24 year old claimant rate increased from 7.8% in March 2020 to 14.2% in May 2021.

In some cases claimants are not unemployed, but are eligible due to low wages and hours. The figures are subject to revision.



Starts are used to summarise the number of new claimants to Universal Credit. It counts the number of people who have accepted their claimant commitment for the first time in an assessment period.



People on Universal Credit are those that have started a claim and no end date has been recorded on the count date. Claimants are expected to do a number of tasks to be eligible depending on their circumstances and one of those is 'searching for work'.



Vacancies

Research by West Yorkshire Combined Authority indicates that the weekly vacancy count for West Yorkshire remains above its pre-crisis level. This has been sustained for several weeks. There was a fall of 4% week ending 22nd May compared to the previous week, based on a four week moving average. Week ending 29th May there was a 1% increase and this was the highest weekly vacancy count since the crisis began. Week ending 5th June had an 8% decrease, but this may reflect the impact of the bank holiday on employer activity. Week ending 12th June had an increase of 5%.






