Over the next six weeks, your child's class will be taking part in lessons which will focus on relationships and sex education (RSE). RSE lessons in Year 9 will include teaching about: healthy relationships, staying safe and consent, developing self-esteem and confidence, sexual health including contraception. Pupils will also have opportunities to ask questions that help prepare them for relationships of all kinds in the modern world. PSHCE education is taught throughout the school in every year group and is monitored and reviewed regularly by the staff and governing body.
